

The General Assembly

The General Assembly of the Community of the Beatitudes, which brought together 71 delegates from 5 continents, was celebrated in Nouan-le-Fuzelier (France), October 27th - November 5th.

The General Assembly was an opportunity for delegates to work on issues of importance to the Community. The two main themes on the agenda were the **historical review** of the Community and the deepening of the experience of the Community's structure as an **Ecclesial Family of Consecrated Life**.

In the General Assembly "we try to see if and to what extent we have been faithful to the charism, in what the Spirit drives us to go forward and in what instead he asks us to change. This is one of the most beautiful and most strongly 'ecclesial' experiences we are granted: to come together to listen to the Spirit, presenting him with real situations, issues, problems... We must ask ourselves if the choices we make are oriented towards bearing witness to and announcing the Gospel" (Pope Francis).

This general meeting has been the occasion for all to have a wonderful **experience of synodality** and community discernment in the Spirit. We listened to each other, brainstorming in working groups, in particular using the "conversation in the Spirit" method used in Rome during the recent synodal session.

Each day was punctuated by liturgical offices, adoration and Holy Mass, encouraging us to continually return to the One who brings us together! We had moments to receive personally, but also communally. The chains of continuous adoration of the Blessed Sacrament and fasting set up in our community houses around the world were impressive and truly sustained us.

Introducing Fr. Juan Diego de Jesús



I was born in Toluca, a State in Mexico, on the 24th of November 1974. I am 48 years old, the youngest of four brothers and sisters. I lost my father when I was 5 years old but my mother is still alive. I grew up in a Christian family very involved in the Charismatic Renewal. From the age of 10 I've had a strong experience of the love of Jesus. The Boyscouts taught me to care for others, especially the poorest of the poor. I received the call to the priesthood at the age of 15, during an evangelization retreat. This call was deeply engraved in my heart and never left me.

After my studies, I led a busy professional life, always thinking about the possibility of marriage, but finally I saw reason in the voice

that had been calling me to the priesthood for a long time. For years, I had the opportunity to participate and organize evangelization missions in the mountains with the poorest of the poor, and it was during this experience that the Lord came looking for me, awakening in me the first call. A visit to the Community of the Beatitudes seduced me and, very soon, I expressed the desire to join it for vocational discernment. I joined the Community in Puebla, Mexico, in 2014, made my perpetual profession of vows in Blagnac (France) in 2021, where I studied philosophy and theology. I was ordained a deacon on July 1, 2022, and my priestly ordination was on July 15, 2023 in the sanctuary of Our Lady of Lourdes. Nine long years of formation have passed and the time has come for me to serve my community through the parish, giving myself one hundred percent, always listening to the Holy Spirit, and at the service of the neediest. *-Fr. Socially, what I enjoyed with the Community was that it was like a big family with the religious, lay and friends of the community. I realized that the religious members of the community were just normal people like you and me who decided to consecrate their life to the Lord. It was possible to be friends with sisters and brothers of the Community! From all the Catholic persons that I met in the US, I was touched by their strong faith. I really appreciated how naturally they spoke about the Lord and how He is present in their life. As I immersed myself in the rhythm of the community, I can tell you - I realized that praying is a real job! After 2 months, I wanted to get some holiday. My two favorite times during the week were the Shabbat office and Vespers of the Resurrection. I really liked Shabbat because, this office on Friday was a

good way to be all together sitting around the table as a family, praying to the Lord for who He is and for all the beautiful things that He offered to us in our week. I was also all the time touched by the Vespers of the Resurrection, especially when one member of the Community took a text in the Gospel (opened the page with the guidance of the Spirit), read it and then give an explanation. I was really amazed how Lord knows what we need to learn at the right time from the Gospel. After these 3 beautiful months, I've learned to trust the Lord; He knows what we need to be happy in our life. Also I lived in from this experience the words of Luke 6:38: "Give, and it will be given to you. (...) For with the measure you use, it will be measured to you." Now I've come back to my life peacefully and I know that I have the Rock (the Lord), that I can stand on. He will never give me up. Even in the face of the storm, He is Present! I would like to thank all the persons that I met during these 3 months! I was touched by their generosity and their testimony of that they shared.
