## **Hebrew Experience**

Many years ago, when I settled down in the States, I created a program to teach Judaism to common folks, the laity sitting in the pews. I wanted to transmit what is essential about Judaism, the Judaity of Jesus and what the Church says about Jews, Judaism, and Israel. This program is called Hebrew Experience. It's comprised of three series of seven classes. Part 1 is the basic elements of the steps in the life of a Jew, a lexicon to understand terms like kosher, tassels, Torah, and the meaning of Shabbat. What are the pilgrimage feasts: Passover, Pentecost, and the feast of Booths? How did Jesus and the apostles, celebrate feasts at their time, and what is left of these celebrations nowadays? Part 2 is the historical feasts, Purim and Hannukah, and the modern celebration linked to the creation of the State of Israel. Part 3 consists in watching movies together, which I comment on while viewing.

This program gives me an opportunity to bring Catholics closer to Jesus and to the Church's theology of Judaism. And, hopefully, to work against antisemitism that still creeps into the hearts of some people. I must have taught more than 300 students, in different parishes in the past years. Here is a testimony from a student: "I have never had a class touch both my mind and my heart in such a way; The doors that it has opened are beckoning me onward to explore in physical and profoundly spiritual ways. May your work be an example for all of us of the joy of following God's will for our lives."



## You did not choose Me, but I chose you. (John 15:16)

This year, 7 aspirants took the step of joining the community to discern if God is calling them to the Beatitudes. The first stage of formation is called Common Formation, and takes two forms:

1-year on-site formation for singles who can live in the community house, or 2-year distance formation for couples and families who live at home but come to the community for formation, service and mission sessions, and who set up a rhythm of prayer at home.

Denver hosts one on-site aspirant: Maria, and 3 couples who live nearby and are following the Distance Common Formation: Terra and Jake Borchers, Luke and Lea Moscoso, and Alex and Marianne Frank.

They heard God's call through the words of Jesus: "You did not choose Me, but I chose you." (John 15:16), and they want to respond to it. Mystery of faith and gift from God, this call invites them to follow Christ until they no longer belong to themselves, but to Christ alone. This time of formation is a time for maturing desire, discernment and discovery of the community's own grace, through talks, fraternal life, spiritual life, mission and service. We entrust them to your prayers!
